- Utilize the A3 sheet effectively without overcrowding or leaving too much empty space.
- Incorporate eco-friendly messages or materials if possible, given the competition is hosted by the Environment Club.
- Students must bring their own colors (sketch pens, paints, crayons, etc.) for the competition.

- Don't copy ideas from others or the internet.
- Ensure your poster does not contain any inappropriate, harmful, or offensive content.
- Don't wait until the last moment to finish the poster, as it may affect its quality.
- Maintain the A3 sheet in good condition; folded or torn sheets may result in disqualification.

#### **DISQUALIFICATION**

- Posters that do not adhere to the given theme will be disqualified.
- Use of inappropriate, offensive, or harmful images or messages will result in immediate disqualification.
- Posters submitted on any sheet other than the A3 size provided by the Environment Club will be disqualified.
- Posters not completed within the allotted time frame will be disqualified.
